### To be safe at OLSG I will...

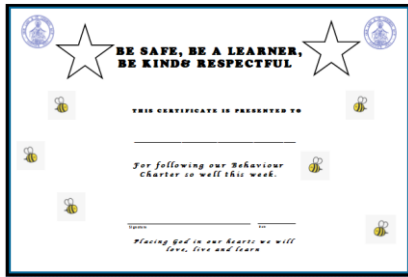
- ✓ Share my worries and concerns with an adult

# Rewards



As an incentive for engagement with learning and for following the 3Bs from our Behaviour Policy, we have implemented the use of Dojo points in each class throughout school.

At the end of each week, the pupil that has received the most Dojo points will receive a 'Dojo Champion' certificate. Similarly, two 'Behaviour Charter' certificates will be awarded to pupils who have followed the behaviour charter throughout the week.

Children will be put into teams and their Dojo points will be included in a House point system, which will accumulate over the week to then be added to their House team.

# Home Reading

At home, we would ask you to...

- Read as often as you can, but at least three times a week for short bursts of time (5-15mins).
- In the home reading record, please put a tick in the box every time you read with your child.
- Please leave a comment in home reading records once the reading book has been finished.
- Finished reading books will be changed every Monday/Tuesday.
- Have home readers in school everyday, just in case there's an extra chance to read.
- Encourage your child to read/share other texts at home too and read for pleasure.

# Homework

- Reading daily but at least 3 times a week with their school book. Ticked to say when read and a comment/signature when finished.
- Maths and/or English set weekly on Purple Mash.
- Occasionally, class teachers may ask children to complete a research piece of homework or a creative activity linked to the wider curriculum.
- Homework will go out every Friday across school.

# P.E. Days

- In Year 3 Finney, children will need their PE kits on Monday and Thursday.
- In Year 3 Anning, children will need their PE kits on Monday and Tuesday.
- Our school PE kit consists of:
  - A white t-shirt, black or navy shorts and PE pumps.
  - Blue plain jogging bottoms, school sweatshirt and trainers can be worn for outdoor P.E.
  - For gymnastics all children should have bare feet.
  - Jewellery must not be worn during P.E. and this includes earrings. At OLSG, we follow Lancashire guidance, which suggests earrings should not be worn in PE lessons (including covered by plasters) as a general rule.
  - Following school policy, earrings should not be worn in school at all, unless recently pierced and agreed by the head teacher.
  - Shoulder length and long hair should be tied back.

# Earrings

Safe Practice in PE states that, 'The Association for Physical Education strongly recommends the practice of removing all personal effects at the commencement of every lesson to establish a safe working environment. This applies to all ear and body piercings.'

The teacher has duty of care for the safety of children.

Staff can not remove or tape (cover) earrings.

Many children can not remove earrings themselves.

School can not be held responsible for losses of removed earrings.

The earrings worn in the past were becoming more and more unsuitable and unsafe as people deviated away from the single plain stud.

**For these reasons, earrings are not allowed in school.**

# Things to Remember

- Water bottles (containing only water).
- If you would like your child to have a snack at break time, please send healthy snacks of fruit or vegetables.
- Ensure inhalers are in school if needed (check the dates please).
- No jewellery to be worn, except for watches (these must be removed for PE).
- No nail varnish or oversized hair accessories.
